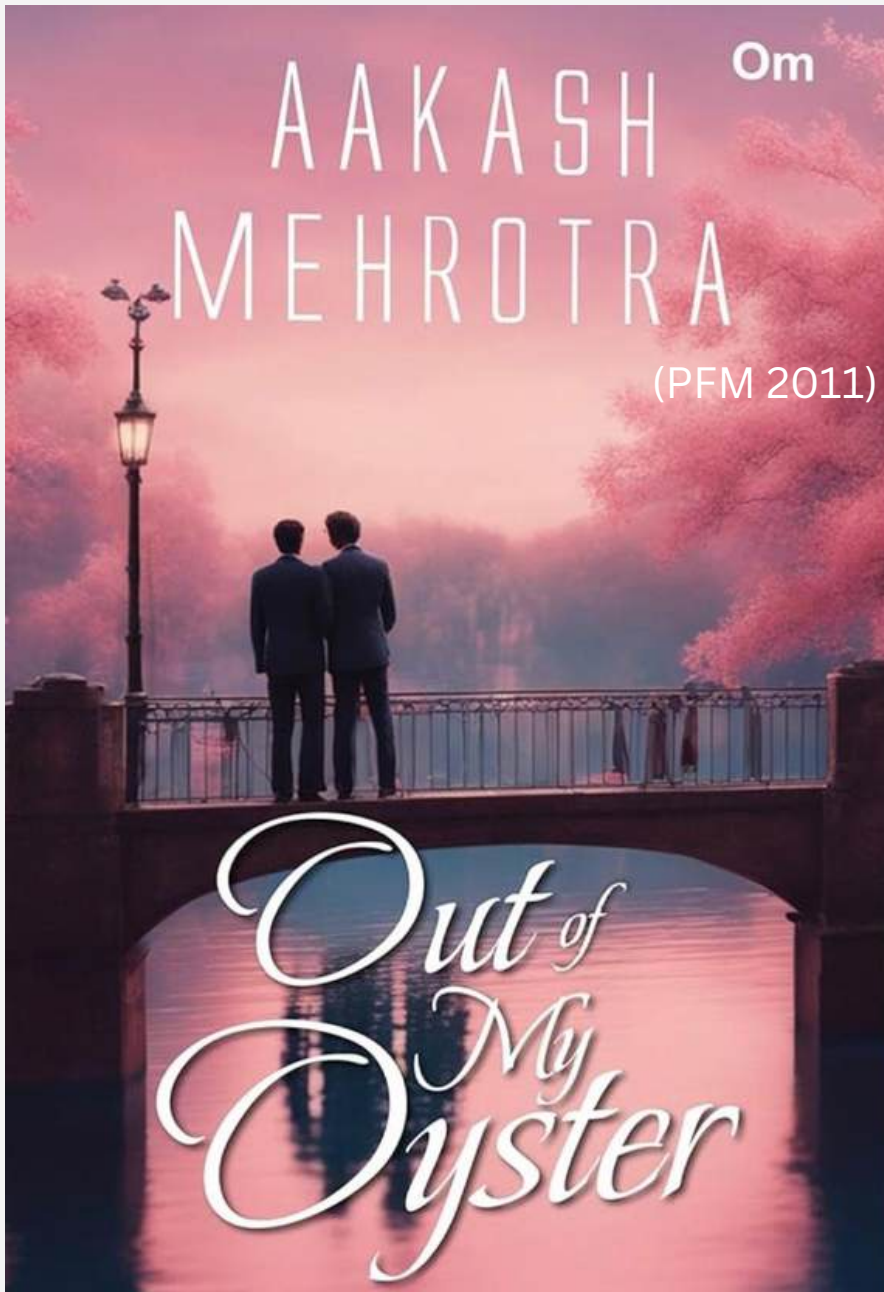

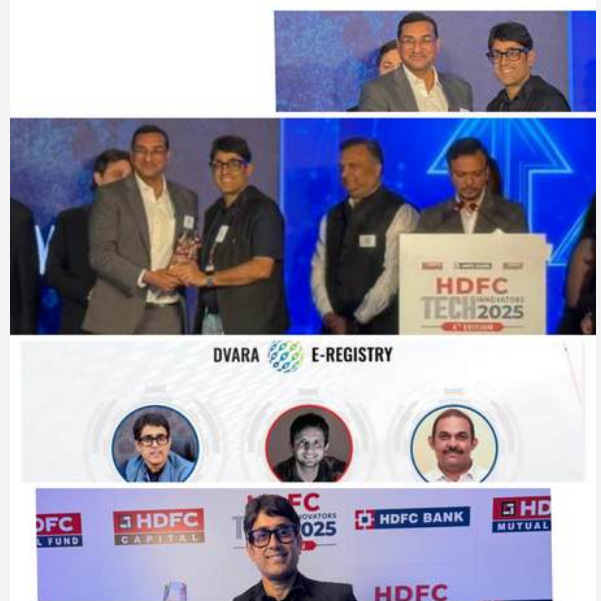

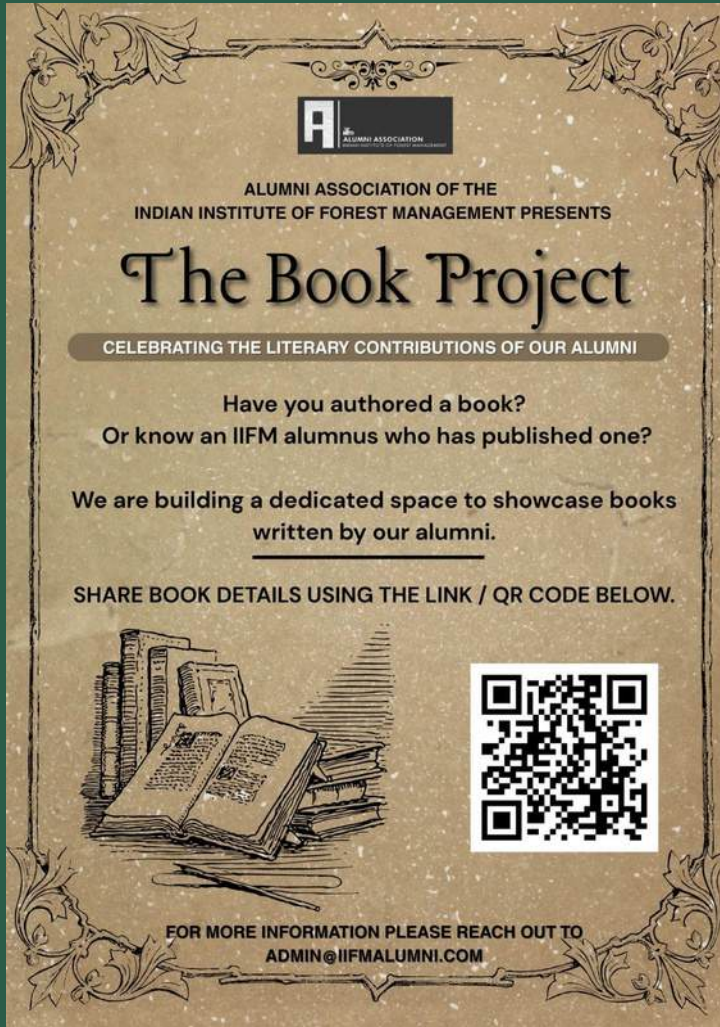

### On the Way to Mirch Masala

It was already dark when our cab began its slow crawl through Ahmedabad's Saturday evening traffic. I was seated in the front passenger seat when a familiar voice floated up from the back.

"Sir, we are having our chapter meet today..."

A pause.

"Yes, sir."

Another pause.

"I am on my way, sir, with Varsha ma'am."

Then again.

And again.

"Sir, are you coming for the alumni meet?"

Each call followed the same rhythm - hopeful opening, a long silence, and then a soft, resigned response. I could hear the disappointment in his voice even when he said "okay, sir" or "yes, ma'am." Yet he kept dialing, patiently, persistently, as though the next call might be the one that worked.

The answers, when they came, were predictable.

"I'm out of town."

"I'm unwell - can't get out of bed."

"Sorry, I already have other plans."

Listening to him, I thought: if he ever chose a career in sales, he'd probably do quite well.

He had the temperament for it: calm, courteous, and stubbornly optimistic. I had met Akash only that afternoon. He had arrived in Ahmedabad that morning after an overnight journey from Okha, in western Gujarat

### Earlier That Day

It was just about noon when my phone rang.

"Hello, ma'am. I'm in Ahmedabad now."

We had been coordinating for weeks about the Ahmedabad chapter meet - date, time, venue - everything planned in consultation with the alumni. After a few minutes of small talk, I asked casually, "So where are you staying?"

There was a pause.

"We are trying to find a place, ma'am."

"Do you have a budget?" I asked, then added helpfully, "You could try the Ginger Hotel..."

His reply stopped me short.

"Something in the range of... even a dormitory will do."

That was when it sank in: this entire trip was self-funded. Just to meet the alumni in town. They had boarded a train that took them to Jamnagar, endured a five-hour layover, and then continued on to Ahmedabad. When they arrived the next morning, they didn't even have a place to stay. Two hours into their search, they called me.

That was when I asked them to come over.

I hesitated, of course. My father is almost completely bedridden, and my senior dog -

giant, gentle, and once unstoppable - has lost his ability to walk due to osteoarthritis.

Both require constant care and attention. And my guest room had quietly turned into a storage space for all the things I didn't quite know what to do with.

But with some help from my father's caretaker, I cleared the room, rearranged things, and made it liveable.

Two hours later, I heard Kaju, my second dog, barking.

Two young men stood at the gate, each with a small backpack slung over one shoulder.

They looked tired, slightly dishevelled, and unmistakably lost. That was when I first met

Akash and Puneet—from the batch of '26.

The Ahmedabad Chapter Meet

A few minutes after we reached Mirch Masala, Prithviraj (PFM '25) joined us. And that - rather unexpectedly - was the Ahmedabad chapter meet. Four people. That was it.

Over dinner, we talked. About families, work, aspirations, job anxieties, and, inevitably, our alma mater. We revisited subjects and professors (with appropriate enthusiasm),

compared notes on the mess, the library, the hostel, and almost everything else that makes up student life at IIFM. For me, it was an unusual evening. I hadn't stepped out socially in a long time. It felt good - uncomplicated, warm, and honest. Time well spent with two current students and a recent alumnus.

Yet, as the evening wound down, a question lingered.

Had the students gotten a raw deal?

After all the effort - overnight travel, personal expense, countless phone calls - why hadn't more alumni shown up?

That question stayed with me long after the traffic thinned and the cab turned homeward.

### Madhav Gadgil: "India's Environmental Conscience"

Madhav Gadgil was a distinguished Indian ecologist whose work has profoundly shaped environmental conservation and community-centric ecological management in India. He is the visionary architect of community-led conservation in India, famously asserting that the health of our ecosystems is inseparable from the sovereignty of the people who inhabit them. As the head of the Western Ghats Ecology Expert Panel (WGEEP), he authored the "Gadgil Report," a definitive document that challenged top-down bureaucracy by advocating for local communities to have a decisive voice in protecting one of the world's most critical biodiversity hotspots.

His work transcends traditional biology, blending scientific rigor with human ecology and social justice. Gadgil has consistently championed the value of indigenous knowledge, demonstrating that sustainable resource management is most effective when it respects the traditional practices of forest-dwelling communities. By bridging the gap between grassroots activism and academic research, he has redefined Indian environmental policy. His legacy remains a foundational pillar for modern sustainability, emphasizing that true ecological preservation must be democratic, inclusive, and rooted in the land's own history.

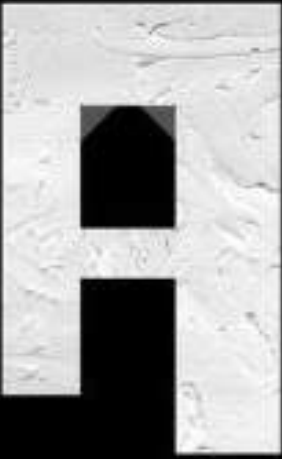
